

2020 Phelps County Fair Livestock Rules

General Livestock Rules

1. Only online registration will be accepted in 2020. All livestock must be registered by no later than 4:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 29th, 2020. Entries received after this date will incur a \$25 late fee/species registered. All exhibitors can begin registering online at: <https://forms.gle/vs4D8PiszSG3Tamv7> starting **June 1, 2020**.
2. All livestock are subject to examination by a licensed veterinarian.
3. Poultry and rabbit entries must be on grounds and set-up by Wednesday of the fair by 4:00 p.m. All other entries must be on the fairgrounds by Thursday of the fair by 12:00 p.m.
4. Each exhibitor will furnish their own feed and bedding.
5. Each exhibitor shall purchase a season pass in advance and exchange it for a wristband on Wednesday of the fair.
6. All awarded ribbon colors will be determined by the judges.
7. Each exhibitor will be paid one premium per class. Premiums will be paid by the color of the ribbon awarded.
8. All cattle shall be halter broke.
9. The Species Superintendent is the only individual authorized to make pen and stall assignments.
10. Breeding livestock will be released at 8:00 p.m. on Saturday of the fair. All exhibitors must check-in with Species Superintendent before removing their animals from the fair. If exhibitors remove livestock on their own accord, all premiums will be forfeited.
11. All open shows will be open to any exhibitors age 5 as of January 1st
12. The exhibitor must obey all rules, or premium money will be forfeited.
13. Livestock pens and stalls **MUST BE** kept clean and tidy throughout the duration of the fair. If Species Superintendent determines livestock pens and stalls are not clean and tidy, premium(s) may be withheld.
14. Tie out space will be provided and tie out time is 9:00 p.m. All livestock must return to the barn by no later than 7:00 a.m. daily.
15. All animals must have been owned and registered at least 30 days before day of show.
16. In order for animals to show in the purebred classes they must be registered, with the exceptions of poultry and rabbits.
17. Exhibitors will not be allowed to have alcoholic beverages at any time. Upon failure to comply with this rule, you will be asked to remove livestock and yourself from the premises. All entry fees and premiums will then be forfeited.
18. Recreational vehicle parking is on a first come first served basis.
19. Only animals entered to show will be allowed in the barns.
20. All hogs must be washed in the wash rack.
21. Cattle ribbon premiums (Blue - \$20, Red - \$15, White - \$10)
22. Swine, sheep, goat premiums (Blue - \$12, Red - \$9, White - \$7)
23. Poultry and rabbit premiums (Blue - \$3, Red - \$2, White - \$1)
24. PeeWee Exhibition Class will be a class offered in the beef cattle, dairy cattle, dairy goats, meat goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine divisions. This will be open to children four years of age or younger as of January 1 of the current fair year. Animals may be male or female and must be born after January 1 of the current fair year. All participants will receive a participation ribbon only. A parent or guardian of the exhibitor will be asked to sign a release of liability waiver during registration. A parent or guardian must accompany the exhibitor and animal in the showing.
25. Showmanship Classes will be held for the following age groups: PeeWee (5-7); Junior (8-10); Intermediate (11-15); Senior (16-21)
26. All rabbit and poultry exhibitors must provide food and water cups which must be secured to the provided cages.
27. All rabbit and poultry exhibitors can only enter one rabbit/bird per breed per class.
28. All rabbit entries must be identified by a permanent tattoo in the left ear.
29. All poultry must have a pullorum test performed Wednesday, August 5th, 2020.

****All entries are made with the distinct understanding that in no event will the Phelps County Fair or Phelps County Fair Livestock Committee be responsible for any injury, loss or damage, which may occur to any person, animal, or article. ****

Market Livestock Rules

Eligibility and Rules

1. To be eligible to sell a market animal, exhibitors must be a member in good standing with a 4-H club or FFA Chapter in Phelps County. Exhibitors may be asked to provide verification of membership standing.
2. Each exhibitor may show two (2) market animals of the same species but may only sell one. Each exhibitor may only sell two (2) species at the Phelps County Fair.
3. If your animal is selected as Grand or Reserve Champion on Foot, that animal **must** sell in the Junior Livestock Auction.
4. The Grand and Reserve Champion on Foot of each species will sell first. All remaining animals of each species will then sell based upon index score.
5. All species except poultry and rabbits must be castrated prior to initial weigh-in.
6. No re-weighs of any market animal will take place at initial or final weigh-ins.
7. In order to sell a market animal, it must be shown in the market class arena within two announced calls for said animal except for poultry and rabbits.
8. Exhibitors are required to participate in fairgrounds clean-up day on Saturday, August 1st, 2020.
9. No market animals may load out until 6:00 a.m. Sunday, August 9, 2020. Exhibitors are responsible for having pens clean by no later than 10:00 a.m. Sunday, August 9, 2020.
10. All market animals which qualify for the Junior Livestock Auction must be harvested.
11. All market animals must be completely dry at final weigh-in for ultrasound to be conducted. If an ultrasound cannot be performed, the index score cannot be calculated, and the animal will be sold at the end of the species sale order.

Market Steer Rules

Initial weigh-in Saturday, March 7, 2020 from 8:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m. at the Phelps County Fairgrounds.

Ultrasound and final weigh-in will take place at 6:00 p.m., Thursday, August 6, 2020.

1. Steers must weigh a minimum of 600 lbs. at initial weigh-in.
2. Steers must be born after January 1, 2019. It is recommended that your steer be born in early spring of 2019.
3. Steers must be dehorned, castrated, and manageable by halter at initial weigh-in.
4. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1,000 lbs. and have an average daily gain of at least 2.0 lbs./day at final weigh-in to be eligible for Junior Livestock Auction.
5. Steers may be shown if weighed in under 1,000 lbs. at final weigh in, but not sold.

Market Hog Rules

Initial weigh-in Sunday, April 26th, 2020 from 2:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. at Phelps County Fairgrounds.

Ultrasound and final weigh-in will take place at 6:30 pm. Thursday, August 6, 2020. at Phelps County Fair.

1. Hogs must weigh between 40-100 lbs. at initial weigh-in. Any hog over 100 lbs. will not be allowed to be weighed in as a market hog.
2. Hogs must be a barrow or gilt at initial weigh-in.
3. Hogs must weigh a minimum of 220 lbs. at final weigh-in at the fair to be eligible for Junior Livestock Auction and hogs weighing over 300 lbs. will be sold at 300 lbs. Hogs may be shown, but not sold if under 220 lbs.
4. Market gilts weighed-in at initial weigh-in can only be shown in the market class at the fair.

Market Pen of Chickens Rules

Final weigh-in will take place at 6:00 p.m. Thursday, August 6, 2020 at Phelps County Fair.

1. Four chickens in a meat pen are considered one species.
2. Chickens can be heritage meat breed of your choice, but all birds must be the same breed.
3. Cornish crosses must be 6-8 weeks old at final weigh-in.
4. Heritage meat breeds must not be over 4 months old at final weigh-in.

5. Each bird must weigh at least 4 lbs. at final weigh-in.

Market Lamb Rules

Initial weigh-in will take place Sunday, April 26th, 2020 from 2:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. at Phelps County Fairgrounds.

Final weigh-in will take place at 6:00 p.m. Thursday, August 6, 2020. at Phelps County Fair.

1. Lambs must be born after January 1, 2020.
2. Lambs must be wethers or ewes at initial weigh-in.
3. Market ewes weighed in at initial weigh-in can only be shown the market class at the fair.
4. Wool lambs must weigh 70 lbs. with an average daily gain of at least 1/3 lb./day at final weigh-in to be eligible for the Junior Livestock Auction.
5. Hair lambs must weigh 60 lbs. with an average daily gain of 1/3 lb./day at final weigh-in to be eligible for the Junior Livestock Auction.
6. It is recommended lambs weigh at least 30 lbs. at initial weigh-in.
7. Lambs may be shown if weighed in under minimum weight, but not sold.
8. All lambs must have a scrapies identification tag.

Market Goat Rules

Initial weigh-in will take place Sunday, April 26th, 2020 from 2:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. at Phelps County Fairgrounds.

Final weigh-in will take place at 6:00 p.m. Thursday, August 6, 2020 at Phelps County Fair.

1. Goats must be full or % meat goat under year of age at final weigh-in (milk teeth must be present).
2. It is recommended goats weigh at least 20 lbs. at initial weigh-ins.
3. It is recommended goats be dehorned.
4. Goats must be wethers or does at initial weigh-ins.
5. Market does weighed-in at initial weigh-in can only be shown in the market class at the fair.
6. Goats must weigh a minimum of 50 lbs. with an average daily gain of at least 1/3 lb./day at final weigh-in to be eligible for Junior Livestock Auction.
7. Goats may be shown if weighed in under minimum weight, but not sold.
8. Goats must have a scrapies identification tag.

Market Rabbit Rules

Final weigh-in will take place at 6:00 p.m. Thursday, August 6, 2020 at Phelps County Fair.

1. Rabbits must be 6 weeks of age, but not over 10 weeks.
2. Rabbits must not weigh over 5 lbs. each at final weigh-in and must be of the same breed and variety.
3. Three rabbits are considered one species

Bucket Calf Requirements

1. Open to exhibitors ages 5 – 12 as of January 1.
2. Bucket calves must be born between January 1, 2020 – May 30, 2020
3. Bucket calves may only be shown in the bucket calf division and may not be shown as part of a cow/calf entry.
4. No entry fee required.
5. Participation ribbon only.

Replacement Heifer Requirements (Junior Only)

Superintendent – Josie Rosenberg (573) 202-4678

1. Heifers must be vaccinated and boosted for IBR,BVD,PI3, BRSV, Lepto (5 way), Vibriosis, and 7 way Clostridia. Follow label instructions for all products used. Heifers must be treated for internal and external parasites within 30 days of sale. Must show receipt of products purchased.
2. Horns and scurs must be removed and completely healed by sale day. Polled is acceptable.
3. Heifers must be open (vet will be onsite at final weigh-in to pregnancy check heifer and guarantee she is open).
4. Picture(s) and description of tagged heifer to jjyr4d@mail.missouri.edu by Wednesday, July 29, 2020 to qualify your heifer. (Use your own tag, must be able to read tag number and see body of animal).
5. Heifers must weigh between 650 – 900 lbs. at final weigh-in.
6. Exhibitor must prepare a short (3-6 sentence) biography about the heifer. This must be turned in at final weigh-in. (This may include, but not limited to: birth date, breed, name, sire and dam info, and vaccinations).
7. It is recommended for exhibitors to test and guarantee that their heifer is negative for BVD-PI.
8. It is recommended that exhibitors choose a fall of 2019 born beef and gain approximately 1.5 – 2.0 lbs/day.
9. The replacement heifers will be sold based upon judges placing and will sell by the head.
10. If all requirements are not met, heifer may show but not sell in the Junior Livestock Auction.
